Jose's Story | Barb Simonsen, OA Tutor

What do you get when you mix a translator, a tutor, a kind boss, a committed mom and dad, a caring pastor, volunteers, a five-yearold boy, prayer and an Almighty God? You get a miracle! Open Arms Hispanic Ministry (OAHM) became acquainted with a little boy named Jose who, when he turned 5, did not speak in any understandable language even to his parents. Throughout Jose's first year of preschool, he never spoke a word. Concerned OAHM friends knew Jose needed to be in school but kept running into closed doors. With guidance from the OAHM Tutoring Coordinator, Tri-County Preschool agreed to see if they could help Jose. Because his family speaks Quiche and very little Spanish, each step of the way from filling out lots of paper work and getting Jose tested, to helping his parents understand schooling options, was complicated. Thanks to much help from OAHM's translator, Pablo, Jose was evaluated and accepted into their preschool program where he would have a speech therapist as part of his schooling. This was great news but required a 40- minute round trip drive twice each day to take and pick Jose up from school. To assist the family, OAHM made the need for transportation known. Six people volunteered to take turns getting Jose to or from school!

Throughout this process, Jose had begun to say some words. If I (an OAHM tutor) said, "say bus", he would say it along with other

words when asked directly, but never without prompting, and never putting two words or even two syllables together. He never answered even yes or no questions, or had the ability to ask for something he needed. In the last four months while in this preschool, thanks to the help of so many, and by the grace of God, I have had the joyful privilege of watching God work in Jose's life. He



now says "goodbye" to his mom when he leaves for school, says the names of many animals and colors, greets his cousins during after-school tutoring and says "goodbye" to them by name without being prompted. Jose counts to five (even to 10 with a little help), and is beginning to put two words together like "yellow bus" or "four frogs". After 5 years of not speaking, this fun, happy, book -loving, people-loving little boy is beginning to talk!

Thanks goes to so many for being the hands and feet of Jesus to this little one and his family. This is community. This is the church. Jesus said, "Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes Me." Mark 9:36
